THERE IS - ARE



We use there is/there are to say that something exists.

We use there isn't/there aren't to say that something doesn't exist.

We use there is/ there isn't + singular noun.



Is there a pink car in the driveway?

Yes, there is.

Is there a snowman in front of the house?

No, there isn't.

We use there are/ there aren't + plural noun.



Are there people in front of the house? Yes, there are.

Are there pets with them? No, there aren't.
